## 2012 Corporate Membership Program

The MDCSCO Corporate Membership Program has four distinct levels, with specific rights and benefits commensurate with each level. Corporate memberships run for one year from the start date of the membership, and may be renewed or modified annually. The levels of membership, annual dues, and benefits for each level are listed below.

### **Diamond (\$20,000)**

**At the Diamond Level, MDCSCO will custom tailor a corporate membership program. The opportunities listed below are for guidance purposes only.**

- Opportunity to be named as the exclusive host of one MDCSCO membership meeting (cost of meeting will be taken from the corporate membership). The corporate member will be given the opportunity to have a table top display at this meeting and to have a product theatre presentation in conjunction with the meeting.
- Inclusion in all membership mailings (including newsletter and meeting notices).
- Opportunity, as a corporate member, to send three representatives to any general membership meeting.
- Priority opportunity to participate in and be the exclusive host (paid separately) of one board of directors meeting. (limit 3 corporate member attendees)
- Invitation to exhibit (table top display) at the annual practice manager's meeting, as well as the Spring general membership meeting/Hot Topics Forum, and any other time during the year when there are exhibit opportunities.
- Inclusion among the list of corporate hosts for the Spring membership meeting, as well as the practice managers' meeting and any other general event where appropriate.

- May provide one article per year for inclusion in the MDCSCO newsletter about a new drug or drug indication.
- Prominent recognition on the MDCSCO Web site (including a hot link) and in the quarterly newsletter as a corporate member.
- One-half page ad in each newsletter issue
- Listing on the ASCO sign as a Diamond Level corporate member

### **Platinum (\$10,000)**

- Inclusion in all membership mailings (including newsletter and meeting notices).
- Opportunity, as a corporate member, to send two representatives to any one general membership meeting.
- Priority opportunity to participate in and be the exclusive host (paid separately) of one board of directors meeting. (limit 3 corporate member attendees)
- Invitation to exhibit (table top display) and be listed as a host at the annual practice manager's meeting **AND** the Spring membership meeting.
- Prominent **logo** listing on the MDCSCO Web site (including a hot link) and a logo in the quarterly newsletter as a corporate member.
- One-third page ad in each newsletter issue
- Listing with logo on the ASCO sign as a Platinum Member

### **Gold (\$5000)**

- Inclusion in all membership mailings (including newsletter and meeting notices).
- Opportunity, as a corporate member, to send two representatives to any general membership meeting.
- Opportunity to participate in and be the exclusive host (paid separately) of one board of directors meeting. (limit 3 corporate member attendees)
- Invitation to exhibit (table top display) and be listed as a host at the annual practice manager's meeting OR the Spring membership meeting.
- Listing on the MDCSCO Web site (including a hot link) and in the quarterly newsletter as a corporate member.
- Listing on the ASCO sign as a Gold member.

### **Silver - \$2500**

- Inclusion in all membership mailings (including newsletter and meeting notices).

- Opportunity, as a corporate member, to send one representative to any general membership meeting.
- Listing on the MDCSCO Web site (including a hot link) and in the quarterly newsletter as a corporate member.
- Listing on the ASCO sign as a Silver corporate member.

### **Special Visibility Opportunities**

*(in addition to corporate membership)*

- Board Meeting Host (exclusive) – host pays for meeting and may send up to two representatives (cost – variable); first priority goes to corporate members.
- Meeting Host (non-exclusive )– \$1500 meeting. (includes advance promotion, signage, and display table). Display tables sold separately for \$800.
- Product Theatre – (limited availability) – Opportunity to give a promotional presentation in conjunction with a MDSCSO general meeting, \$1500

\*NOTE: At meetings where elected officials are present, corporate members may attend, but may not have display tables.

**At all levels offerings may be adjusted by mutual consent within the same overall value level.**

<b>Part II Certification</b>	
Under penalties of perjury, I certify that:	
1. The number shown on this form is my correct taxpayer identification number (or I am waiting for a number to be issued to me), and 2. **General Instructions**

Section references are to the Internal Revenue Code unless otherwise noted.

**Purpose of Form**

A person who is required to file an information return with the IRS must obtain your correct taxpayer identification number (TIN) to report, for example, income paid to you, real estate transactions, mortgage interest you paid, acquisition or abandonment of secured property, cancellation of debt, or contributions you made to an IRA.

Use Form W-9 only if you are a U.S. person (including a resident alien), to provide your correct TIN to the person requesting it (the requester) and, when applicable, to:

1. Certify that the TIN you are giving is correct (or you are waiting for a number to be issued),
2. Certify that you are not subject to backup withholding, or
3. Claim exemption from backup withholding if you are a U.S. exempt payee. If applicable, you are also certifying that as a U.S. person, your allocable share of any partnership income from a U.S. trade or business is not subject to the withholding tax on foreign partners' share of effectively connected income.

**Note.** If a requester gives you a form other than Form W-9 to request your TIN, you must use the requester's form if it is substantially similar to this Form W-9.

**Definition of a U.S. person.** For federal tax purposes, you are considered a U.S. person if you are:

- An individual who is a U.S. citizen or U.S. resident alien,
- A partnership, corporation, company, or association created or organized in the United States or under the laws of the United States,
- An estate (other than a foreign estate), or
- A domestic trust (as defined in Regulations section 301.7701-7).

**Special rules for partnerships.** Partnerships that conduct a trade or business in the United States are generally required to pay a withholding tax on any foreign partners' share of income from such business. Further, in certain cases where a Form W-9 has not been received, a partnership is required to presume that a partner is a foreign person, and pay the withholding tax. Therefore, if you are a U.S. person that is a partner in a partnership conducting a trade or business in the United States, provide Form W-9 to the partnership to establish your U.S. status and avoid withholding on your share of partnership income.
